

## "AND THEY WENT EVERYWHERE..." REPORTS FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD!

Dear brethren,

In 2011 we had operations in EIGHTEEN nations of the world! The impact continues and is astonishing. The Lord's Church is gaining immeasurable respect and recognition through these actions. Each day I receive emails from numerous brethren expressing their gratitude for the assistance that is provided and reporting how the containers of benevolence commodities shipped are making a never before seen impact. It is encouraging to read how our brethren are following the New Testament pattern in combining benevolent actions that provide opportunities for preaching the doctrine of Christ.

Below are some of the highlights of reports that I have received. I am sharing these with you so you will also rejoice in the great good that is being accomplished in the name of our Lord and His Church.

### SOMALIA



In July 2011 we received an urgent request to help send containers into the strife-torn nation of Somalia. The situation was very bad and the Islamic pressure has devastated the nation. In the south the nation is gripped by anarchy. Many have fled the south for the semi-security of the north or have gone into the surrounding countries of Ethiopia and Kenya. There is really no place that offers security. The on-ground situation is a hellish existence that our worst nightmares cannot conceive. The Islamists are openly destructive and have no regard for the dignity of human life. People are mutilated and murdered. Little children are thrown away. *After reading briefs and seeing photos of what is happening in Somalia I NEVER want to hear anyone tell me that Islam is a peace loving religion! NEVER!*

During July we had groups in Columbus, MS and Searcy, AR meeting to divide 45,000 pounds of rice into 10 pound portions that were held in a two-gallon zip lock bag. We then placed these zip lock bags into a pillow case to assure that the rice would not burst and be lost. The bags were then placed into 5-gallon buckets or into pallet boxes and transported to the IDP camps in Somalia. Also sent were one-gallon zip lock bags containing a personal hygiene kit, "family buckets" containing a larger amount of personal hygiene items and also "kitchen buckets" that contained basic household kitchen items. Packaging the commodities in this manner allowed for a speedy distribution where families could quickly receive the assistance without being burdened with a fifty pound bag of rice or losing much rice as we tried to pour out a quantity from a large bag when surrounded by thousands of people seeking the food.



Below is communication and a follow up report that was given to me to share with those who have assisted us in sending immediate relief to those in the Internally Displaced People (IDP) camps that are situated in northern Somalia.

## SHIPMENT REPORT #2 HUMANITARIAN AID SHIPMENT TO SOMALIA JANUARY 2012

Thanks to the generous support of churches of Christ needy beneficiaries in northern Somalia were able to start the New Year with much needed food and household supplies. In response to the drought-related food crisis in Somalia, two containers were sent to northern Somalia with relief aid. Distributions from these two containers took place between December 29, 2011 and January 9, 2012. In the fifteen IDP camps, such as Shabeele, Ajuuraan, Wabari, Riiga and Barwaaqo, in Garowe, Puntland, Somalia, 1,120 IDP households each received 20 kilograms of rice and an empty plastic bucket for storage. At the same fifteen camps, 270 families each received a hygiene kit and 200 families each received a kitchen kit. All of the distributions have taken place at Kaalo Social Center in Garowe, Puntland, located in close proximity to the IDP camps. 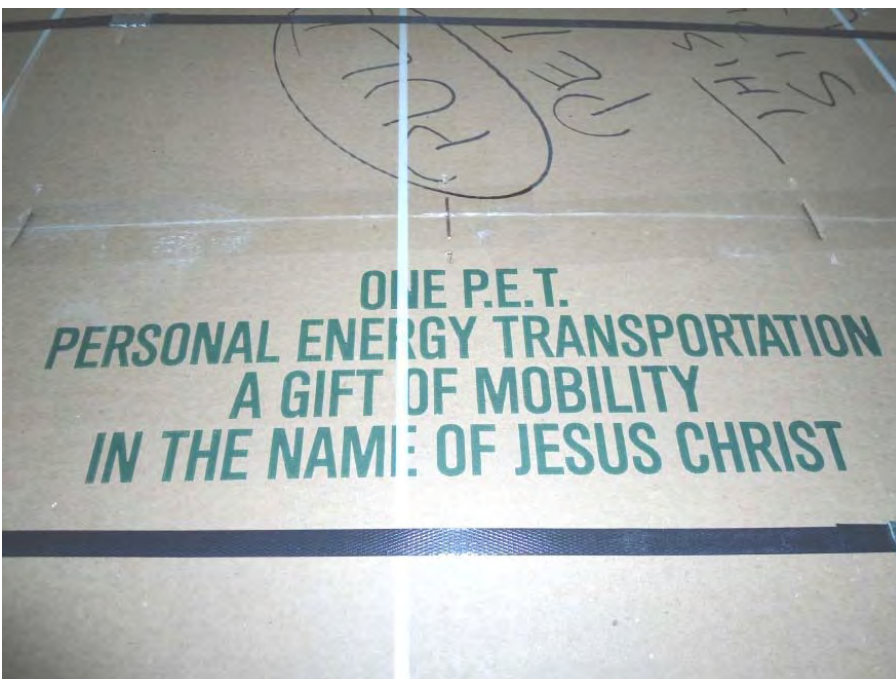
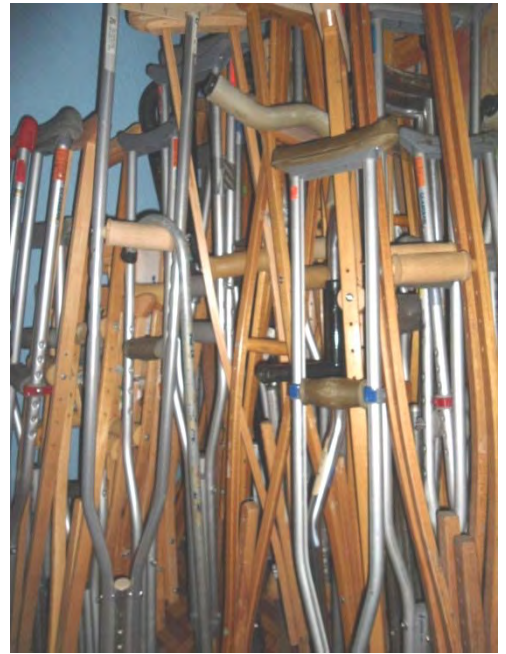
### STATUS REPORT #1 HUMANITARIAN AID SHIPMENT TO ECUADOR

In late October of 2011 we were asked if it would be possible to help a group called *Fundacion Vista Para Todos*, located in Quito, Ecuador. They implement programs for people with physical disabilities and patients with permanent injuries or illnesses throughout Ecuador. Efforts of the Lord's Church to work in this nation have been difficult so we were willing to assist and present the Lord's Church in a positive manner.

This shipment contained personal transportation carts (all terrain wheelchairs), crutches, canes and walkers, and boxes of orthopedic supplies and hospital outfittings. Through the cooperative efforts of the churches of Christ the commodities and cash donations were received. Additionally, these important contributions were leveraged through U.S. government funding. The port to port portions of the transportation costs were covered by the U.S. government's Ocean Freight Reimbursement program.

The container loaded on November 16, 2011 in Norfolk, NE, left the port in New York, NY on a cargo ship on December 6, 2011. The container arrived in Quito, Ecuador on December 13, 2012 and the commodities were unloaded at the consignee's warehouse.

*Fundacion Vista Para Todos* is currently developing a distribution plan to beneficiaries in the different communities and to the people that the organization directly serves. We will also continue to provide relevant distribution feedback and photos when they become available. Stay tuned!



## NIGERIA

In 2011 we shipped two containers into Nigeria. This was the second time we shipped helping our brethren in the Nigerian Christian Hospitals (NCH) in their work. This project required longsuffering because the containers were "lost" for a period of time due to the shipper's mistakes. Because of the mistakes the shipper gave the containers to us (usually these are emptied and returned or purchased by the recipients for \$3,000-\$5,000). Eventually the containers arrived and were offloaded and then we faced another delay as an element in Nigeria attempted to claim they owned the containers and were demanding that we pay them for the containers or empty the containers and give the containers back to them (and then they would sell the containers at a huge cost because empty cargo containers in Nigeria are prized possessions). Eventually we fought our way through that obstacle and finally the containers were taken to their destinations. Distribution has been completed and below is some of the communication that resulted.

Dear John Kachelman,

As the year is running to a close, I want to give you a comprehensive update on the 2 X 40ft containers sent to us (one to Nigerian Christian Hospital and the other to Zikora Medical Centre Ltd) in Aba, Abia state Nigeria. It took the containers a long time to arrive the shores of Onne Port-Harcourt due to some unforeseen circumstances from the shippers during trans-loading from Cotonou to Nigeria. Apart from this trans-shipment delay which lasted for about four months (March 2011-June 2011), every other thing went on very smoothly and fast. The two containers were finally delivered to Onne, Port-Harcourt on the 24th of June, 2011 and the clearing procedures commenced which lasted and was completed by inspection of the two containers by all the eleven government agencies on the 7th of July 2011. We were to take delivery of the containers but for the strike action embarked by the custom agents at the wharf. This strike action was called off on the 19th of July, 2011 and the two containers were delivered to their respective destinations of Zikora Medical Centre Ltd, Ogborhill, Aba and Nigerian Christian Hospital, Nlagu, both in Abia State.

It is noteworthy to mention that during the period of the search for the containers to the time they were located in Cotonou in June, 2011, the Shippers viz. Sealift Inc USA, magnanimously donated the empty containers to us free of charge as a compensation for the protracted time it took the containers to arrive Nigeria (four months!!!!). They issued us certificates to that effect. The trans-shipping company reps in Nigeria (Alraine Nig Ltd) wanted to fraudulent confiscate the containers, but we, through the timely intervention of my wife, Honorable Justice Ory Zik Ikeorha, the containers were released and retained by us respectively). This is a big lesson to all of us, that this delay turned out to be a great blessing to us all. The empty containers now serve as sources of secured storage facilities for us in our various locations! We at Zikora, split the 40ft into two equal parts and had them both reconstructed and painted into 2 x 20ft containers (see P1-,P2- & P3- attached).

### **REDISTRIBUTION:**

#### **1. Nigerian Christian Hospital, Nlagu (Container CCLU 502007-0):**

Nigerian Christian Hospital took delivery of their own 1 X 40ft container of medical equipment and shared some with two other rural medical clinics of Palmer Memorial Hospital, Itu in Akwa-Ibom State, Nigeria and the Mbaise Clinic in Imo State, Nigeria. Letters of acknowledgment will soon be sent directly through Tom Carr or as I collect same from Dr Eguzo.

#### **2. Zikora Medical Centre Ltd, Ogborhill, Aba (Container#CCLU 501080-5):**

a. Aba Ngwa Mission Hospital, Umunna-Ano, Osisioma was given the following equipment and medical supplies: Big Bed stretcher-on-wheels (Stryker) - 1; Drug Cupboard - 1; Potty Chairs - 10; Standing Weighing Scale - 1; Walkers (orthopedic) - 10; X-ray Viewing Board - 1; Audio-Visual Teaching Screen - 1; Dental Chair(110V) - 1; and some Medical & Surgical Supplies.

- b. St Paul's Hospital, Umungasi, Aba was given the following equipment and medical supplies: Dental Chair (110V) - 1; Drug Cupboard - 1; Potty Chairs - 5; Surgical towels - 50; Walkers (orthopaedic) - 10; Sunshade Attachment glasses - 150; and some Medical & Surgical supplies.
- c. Prime Specialist Clinic, Omuma, Aba (Dr S.O.Mbaleme—Orthopedic Surgeon) was given most of the orthopedic equipment and medical supplies.
- d. Dr J.K. Ordu, Consultant Cardiologist, Abia State Teaching Hospital, Aba was given some equipment, medical supplies, clothing materials for their Health outreaches to the villages in Imo and Abia States.
- e. Fanny Royal Hospital, 4 Bimkol Crescent, GRA Phase II, Port-Harcourt, Rivers State, Nigeria (Dr Smart Ebinne -Consultant Ob/Gyn) was given Audio-visual screen, scrubs suits, lap-towels, some surgical/medical supplies etc.
- f. Shalom Mission Academy, Ahiaba Umueze, Aba (Barrister & Mrs Precious Anya) was given 1 audio-visual screen, 1 large teaching world Map, 2 cartons of writing pencils for students and a functioning Lamp-Projector.
- g. Zikora Medical Centre has been given out free of charge all the walkers, crutches and walking sticks to all those patients who cannot afford to buy such ones or who are using poorly locally fabricated ones! The hospital has since been besieged by many with Musculoskeletal disorders as a result of e.g. Poliomyelitis, Road Traffic Accidents, Diabetes Mellitus, Hypertension (CVA), etc.
- h. Dr Mike Enyinnah (General Surgeon with Federal Medical Center Umuahia) was also given some medical and surgical supplies.

I will forward soon the letters of appreciation from most of the clinics and hospitals who benefitted from this shipment.

Dear Brother Tom

Greetings from Nigerian Christian Hospital (NCH).

I write with utmost pleasure to formally thank you for the donation of the 40ft Container that was delivered to us in July, by Dr Zik and brother Brecwaits. It came at a time when we had acute need for supplies. We were thrilled to find that the things in the container were more like a copy of the list in our minds. It was delivered safely and intact. The two sister hospitals had also taken their share of the content: hope you got the pictures I sent earlier.

Back here in NCH, we have been able to put many of the things from the shipment into use. Such as:

1 The weighing scale was taken to the Chest Clinic. It helps us determine the weights of patients with Tuberculosis, in order to calculate their drug dosages.

2 The Incubator, had been taken to the laboratory. Although it is not functioning at optimal capacity, due to some mechanical faults, it has no doubt enhanced our ability to culture specimens for best result.

3 Trolleys (gurneys): There were a good number of trolleys there. Two have been deployed to the emergency unit, while one is kept in front of the maternity ward. They are all being used during emergencies. In fact, the one at the maternity ward has enabled us do some life saving procedures, since it also doubles as an operating table.

4 BP apparatus: one unique BP machine was included in the shipment. It has rollers, and its height is adjustable. Thus we use it in the Maternity ward for patients who maybe too ill or in labor. That saves us the stress of having to find a place to keep the usual BP machine on the patient's bed.

5 Table: The table that was included in the shipment has relieved the old (but short) table in the maternity ward. That makes us have better work space and look more professional.

6 Towel Trolleys (rolling carts): You sent us a couple of trolleys that have partitions inside. We did not know what they were for. But we have distributed them in the wards, where they are used to transport beddings, and 'packs' for sterilization. This makes our work look decent, especially when taking bed sheets to and from the laundry, nurses do not have to carry them exposed on a wheel chair.

7 Stainless Cabinet: This cabinet was taken to the theater (operating room), and has replaced the old, locally fabricated, table-top cabinet. It has more storage space and has helped decongest the theater.

8 Surgical instruments: We have found the instruments in the shipment very useful. So far we have replaced over 37 assorted, old instruments with new ones. That has made our surgeries easier.

There are other things in the container that we have not put to use yet. We keep taking things from our 'new store' as need arises.

Finally, I am sorry for sending this report rather late. It was not actually neglected, but some other things took higher priority. Once again, we are indeed grateful to you for this wonderful gift. May God bless you richly. By the way, IHCF was given an award by NCH during our just concluded NCH AWARDS 2011, as SUPPORTER OF THE YEAR 2011. The award plaque will be delivered by Dr Camazine or Don Thomposon.

Good day to you and my best wishes for a blessed and productive 2012! All is well. Manno got the truck and container off to Gonaives early this afternoon. He contacted Pacius who told him he could handle the discharge of the cargo but could not take the container off the chassis (there may be something lost in the

translation about that verbal exchange), and he asked if Manno could take care of that for him. Fortunately, Manno has worked with that truck driver many times and they've done the "take the container off the chassis routine the Haitian way" many times. The driver left with block and tackle, chains, ropes etc to do the job. He will charge the equivalent of US\$125 for that, in my estimation a very sweet deal. Please instruct Pacius to add the \$125 to the previous agreed balance to be transferred to Manno.

*When you have sighed a sigh of relief that your container was loaded in Judsonia, AR on December 17, traveled by truck and train to Miami, jumped on a ship leaving to Cap Haitien the same day it arrived, was cleared in Cap Haitien, trucked and in your Gonaives compound on January 4 for a TOTAL OF 19 DAYS DOOR TO DOOR, let me know how you feel about this 'test run', both the service and the costs incurred. It has been a challenge, AND, as always a pleasure to assist you.*

Dear John:

I am delighted that aid to the veterans of Ukraine is working out. This project has been underway quite a few years; I recall being at a meeting with General-Colonel Vorontsov in Kyiv in March 2008 when VVA reps Jack Devine and Gary Jones discussed the wheelchairs. Attached is a photo of that meeting. General Vorontsov is third from the left talking to Jack Devine.

To clarify General Vorontsov's rank: he was promoted to General-Colonel in the Ukrainian Army on June 22, 2000, although he came up through the Soviet Army (that part of the Soviet Army in Ukraine became the Ukrainian Army in 1991). And although General-Colonels

wear only three stars on their epaulets, they are generally held as equivalent to U.S. four-star generals. Their commands are at the level of an army.

The transliteration of Russian names into Ukrainian is also a problem sometimes. The English spelling of the Ukrainian equivalent of the Russian Vladimir is Volodymyr. We hope it is not significant that one of the most popular names in Great, Little, and White Russia means "Ruler of the World?!"
